A. ...Involves Being People of God 6:8-14 (pg. 331)

Initially, Elisha was simply referred to as the *man of God*. Today we are called to speak for God—at work; at school; at home; in our neighborhoods.

As we live out our identity in Christ, we are transformed. Then it becomes progressively more natural for us to DO the things that please God.

Our strategy for discipleship:

1. Worship Celebrations.

2. Community Groups.

Salt of the earth. Primarily, salt preserves.

Light of the world. Light illuminates the way.

3. Service Opportunities.

Service stretches our faith. Service validates our message about Christ.
